Key findings from Amplifying Sorority Campaign-funded research:

 Sororities have an opportunity to tell our story better; we have what Gen Z women need and want, they just don't know it yet.

 There is power in personas (Memory Makers, Identity Explorers, Comfort Seeks, Focused Achievers). Gen Z is not a monolith, and sororities can enhance communication and chapter activities catered to each.

 Social connection is the currency of sorority. It is the most powerful and consistent lever to maintain and improve retention.

 Our new members see leadership opportunities as a key reason to join, and benefit from almost immediately upon joining.

 In nearly every single measure, when compared to their peers, sorority women have more positive mental health and well-being.

Key findings from Fraternities Matter Campaign-funded research:

- Fraternity members experience lower levels of anxiety and depression than unaffiliated peers.
- Fraternity alumni *significantly outpace their peers* 62% compared to 34% when it comes to career well-being.
- Fraternity alumni are 5x as likely to give back financially to their alma mater.
- Fraternity members show *significantly higher learning gains* than their peers in their first year of college.
- 83% of fraternity members indicate *stronger leadership confidence* as a result of their fraternity membership.
- Fraternity alumni are more likely to strongly agree their education was worth the cost.
